From Our Assistant Principal

Dear Parents,

Those of you who have never bullied or been bullied at school were probably observers of bullying at some time. In the past bullying was considered a natural part of growing up that people needed to accept as part of the process of becoming strong adults. People used to believe smoking was okay, not a problem. Now we know better. People used to believe bullying was acceptable, to be tolerated, not a big deal. Now, we know better. Researchers have identified the real, long term emotional and physiological effects that chronic bullying can cause.

The State of Connecticut has passed legislation in response to new knowledge about the effects of bullying on children. On June 12, 2008, Governor Rell signed into law a measure that strengthens state and local efforts to prevent school bullying. The law, An Act Concerning School Learning Environment (P.A. 08-160), requires – among other things - that every school board implement a bullying prevention strategy, that the State Department of Education develop model practices, and that bullying prevention become an in-service training topic for school personnel.

Under the law “bullying” means “any overt acts by a student or a group of students directed against another student with the intent to ridicule, harass, humiliate or intimidate the other student while on school grounds, at a school-sponsored activity or on a school bus, which acts are *committed more than once against any student during the school year.*” This new language replaces the prior law’s phrase: “*repeated against the same student over time.*”

Simply put, bullying has no place in our schools. The new law states that a student who has two documented bullying offenses within a school year must be given an in-school suspension. The suspension is documented and becomes part of the child’s permanent school record. The record is expunged upon a student’s graduation from high school. Notification of the suspension is given to the Superintendent of our district and is also reported to the State Department of Education.

Mrs. Parker and I are committed to promoting and ensuring that the school climate at Helen Keller Middle School remains conducive to teaching and learning that is free from threat, harassment and any type of bullying behavior. You will be notified by one of us directly should your child be involved in a verified act of bullying. I urge you to review the Easton Board of Education policy on

bullying with your child. You may find this policy numbered 5131.21 in the er9.org website, where you can see details of specific behaviors classified as bullying. All district policies and regulations may be found under the link to the Easton Board of Education. We do not have an ugly or unhealthy environment at Helen Keller Middle School: bullying is in fact rare. But we want to keep it that way, and this new law will help to ensure that.

If your child is suffering in any way from what you believe to be bullying, please inform Mrs. Parker or myself so that we may respond promptly. Some of the saddest situations I have encountered occurred when a student or parent informed me – in May or June – that bullying had taken place against a student all year long. Please – don’t just close your eyes and hope it will go away. Let us help.

As you send your child off to school each morning, please remind him or her to be nice and work hard at school. If every student focused on those two simple principles, we would have a better learning environment for all.

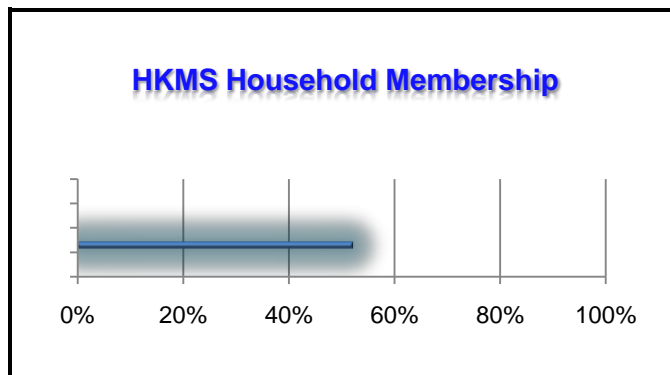
