THE PRINCIPAL'S SCOOP by Kimberly Fox-Santora

As if you didn't already know, the social event of the season is this Friday, October 31st! For those of you new to Samuel Staples, Halloween is a fun-filled school day, starting with a parade and ending with a class party. What could be better?

Due to the large size of our school, we will hold one parade for students in pre-kindergarten through grade 2 at 9:30 and a second parade for students in grades 3-5 at 10:30. Parents are encouraged to watch the parade and take pictures of their favorite goblin, princess or superhero.

Our students will parade around the front car loop. The entire side walk is reserved for the students, while parents are relegated to the grassy hill in the center of the loop. I will lead the parade one grade level at a time, beginning with the youngest grade level. Each parade will take about 40 minutes.

Costumes with blood, gore or weapons are expressly prohibited. Those students in violation of this rule will not be allowed to participate in the festivities.

Parking is always a challenge on this day. The Easton Police Department will be on-hand to help us guide the traffic flow. I strongly encourage parents to carpool, come early and park in the back of the school.

On a different topic, school is in session on Election Day, and we have been working closely with the police department to closely monitor school security on a day when we expect an unprecedented number of visitors to the school.

We developed a very elaborate parking plan for the staff at SSES to allow enough parking spaces for the voters and the poll workers. I have asked the teachers not to schedule any parent volunteers on November 4th, so that we can minimize the number of cars in the parking lot and reduce the number of visitors in the building.

I am very concerned about parent pick-up in the afternoon of Nov. 4th because the driveway will be restricted to voters with handicapped parking needs and senior citizens. ***I implore you to allow your children to take the school bus home next Tues., Nov. 4th.*** There simply is no place to queue up the number of cars we get on a typical day.

NURSE NOTES



-- Flu Season is Coming! Keeping Kids Healthy --

Know the difference between a cold and the flu: If you have a stuffy nose, sneezing, sore throat and a hacking cough, you probably have a cold. If you have a high fever, severe headache, muscle and body aches, extreme tiredness and a dry cough, you probably have the flu.

Practice healthy habits...

1. **Wash your hands often** with soap and warm water for at least 20 seconds to prevent germs from spreading. Also avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth because viruses can spread when your hands touch surfaces that are infested with germs. If you are sick, stay home to help yourself get better and prevent others from getting sick too.
2. **Cover your mouth and nose** with a tissue when coughing and sneezing, and throw away your used tissues in a proper receptacle. It is recommended that you cough and sneeze into your arm.
3. **Don't share** drinks, water bottles, eating utensils, or cell phones with friends.
4. If possible, **get a flu vaccine**.
5. If your child has a sore throat for a few days that does not improve, call the doctor.

CHILDREN MUST STAY HOME 24 HOURS FEVER-FREE

Staying home will likely shorten the length of the illness and will help prevent the “sharing of germs” in school.

When calling your child in sick please leave us a message telling us what is wrong with your child so we can better track illnesses in school. Please refer to the health guidelines in the calendar under “Illness” if you are unsure when to keep your child home.

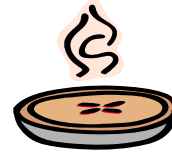

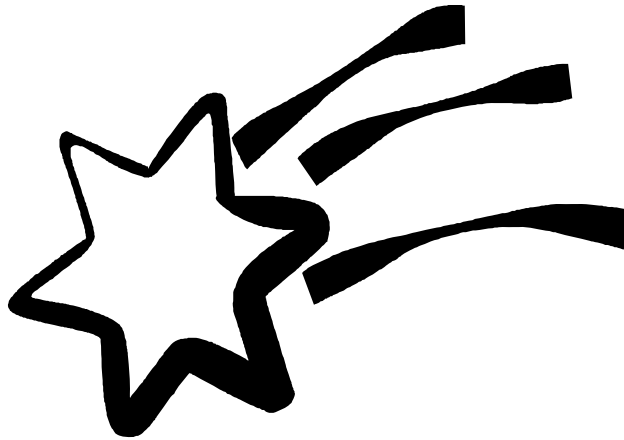
